Counsellor's Corner

During the past two months, Andrew students have been learning about how healthy people are proactive versus reactive, as well as learning that we have control over ourselves but not others.



Students have also been practicing mindfulness, as a way to give their brain a one minute break from a challenging task by focusing on a sound (our singing bowl), as well as learning and practicing mindful breathing. We use candle breaths: a breath in through the nose and a gentle breath out through the mouth which would just make a candle's flame flicker. In the next few weeks, we will be learning to engage our diaphragm using belly breaths. Engaging our diaphragm helps reduce our heart rate, triggers a relaxation response, and helps us feel grounded. You may do something similar to prepare yourself for a challenging task where you take a deep breath in through your nose, a slight pause, and then out your nose again (a deep sigh). 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Learning Disruption Funding for Grades 2-3

At the end of last school year, the Government of Alberta announced 2021-22 funding for school divisions to help address learning disruptions for grades 1 to 3 students caused by the pandemic. Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has received \$791,840 in learning disruption funding to support students in grades 2 and 3, a portion of which has been allocated to Andrew School.

The funding will provide targeted programming for specific students identified as requiring additional support in literacy and numeracy. At our school, grades 2 and 3 students participated in the Star Reading Assessment and the Numeracy Assessment Screener earlier this year to assess students' literacy and numeracy levels. Those below the 25th percentile were identified as needing additional support and eligible for funding. The Government of Alberta learning disruption funding received—at a per-student funding rate of \$490—will support targeted intervention programming for these students.

If your child was identified as needing additional support, you'll receive more information directly from the school. Intervention programming for identified students will begin in December.

Here are a few of the School Council's initiatives this month:

- Christmas Store
 - We are very excited to offer the Christmas Store again this year. And we are happy to announce that the kids will be able to pick gifts in person (in small groups). This will be taking place on December 6 & 8! Following the kids' gift selections, invoices will be sent home for payment of the gifts. Parent council volunteers will be wrapping the gifts to send home on December 17.
- Christmas Raffle
 - We have started gathering donations for our raffle which will consist of various gift baskets, some for adults and some for kids. The adult basket tickets will be \$10 each and \$5 each for the kids baskets. Tickets will be available throughout the community and we are asking parents to help us sell tickets also. Parents can pick up tickets at the school or by contacting a member of our executive.

Our goal for this fundraiser is to raise enough money to cover the cost of swimming lessons for all kids in kindergarten to grade 6. The winners will be announced during the virtual Christmas concert.

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Returning Student Registration for 2022-23

Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will once again conduct an online returning student registration process to confirm student registrations for the 2022-23 school year. Families of all current students—with the exception of graduating Grade 12 students—must complete the process to confirm the school their child plans to attend in the 2022-23 school year or advise the Division of their plans not to return to EIPS. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. The 2022-23 returning student registration takes place Feb. 1-28, 2022.

Access to the Returning Student Registration Form is provided through the PowerSchool Parent Portal. If you don't have a PowerSchool Parent Portal account, you need to set one up before Feb. 1, 2022. Create a PowerSchool Parent Portal account

Inclement Weather

With the winter season almost here, we want to remind families to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) advises families of any bus cancellations using various communications tools—automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on www.eips.ca and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations, and notification through both the Bus Status and the Ride 360 apps. Morning bus cancellations are posted on www.eips.ca by 6:30 a.m.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that state, "school bus service may be suspended...when there is a forecast or current temperature of -40 C, including wind chill factor, in one or more regions." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road conditions. When school bus services are suspended, schools remain open to students. EIPS believes families have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather.
