3. COVID-19

- If families would like masks or rapid testing kits, please contact the school.
- Visitors, Volunteers and Service Providers Entering EIPS
 - i. Visitors, volunteers and contractors are permitted in the school or workplace as long as they have a specific reason for being there and follow the site-visitor protocol—appointments are recommended. EIPS schools no longer require proof of vaccination. However, given the continued presence and high transmissibility of the Omicron variant, onsite rapid testing is mandatory for all volunteers when entering an EIPS building—kits available at the school. As well, anyone entering an EIPS school or building must complete the COVID-19 Alberta Health Daily Checklist, sign the visitor log, sanitize hands, physically distance and wear a medical-grade mask.

SCHOOL GOAL 1: By implementing intentional use of best practices and small group instruction, all students will demonstrate growth in their number sense as indicated on their progress reports in November, March and June. 80% of grade 6 students will demonstrate an achievement level of acceptable on the June PAT.

SCHOOL GOAL 2:By building capacity for all staff to regularly implement evidence-based practices in the five pillars of reading, all students will demonstrate statistically significant growth as measured by reading screeners and the STAR assessment, administered in September, January and May.

SCHOOL GOAL 3: Through effective engagement of students, parents, and staff, Andrew School will provide a safe and caring learning environment measured in growth yearly through Alberta Education Assurance Measure Survey, EIPS Parent Survey, and other school-based surveys.

5. Kindergarten and Returning Student Registration (RSR)

 Kindergarten and Returning Student Registration has begun. All current families should have received an email with the link and instructions (for returning student registration). Returning Student Registration closes February 28.

6. Alberta Education Assurance Surveys

• As an annual check-up on the education system, the Assurance Surveys provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success. We expect these to come out at the end of January or February.

- i. Parents of students in grades 4 and 7 will receive a survey from Alberta Education.
- ii. Students in grades 4 through 6, as well as all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school

7. School Fees

- O Planning for next year has begun. At the beginning of January, we sent out a message to all families regarding school fees for the upcoming year. All fees are "cost recovery", meaning that the school does not make money from supervision or field trip fees. Fees can be found on our school website under "About" and then clicking "Fees." - January School Council meeting school fees were discussed and a new noon hour supervision fee was presented.
- In March, I will present our proposed fees and answer any questions you may have
- O Just a reminder that teachers select field trips that they feel will be beneficial for students and that are aligned with the Alberta curriculum. They work hard to ensure that we receive the best value for our dollar. All fees are "cost recovery", meaning that the school does not make money from supervision or field trip fees. Each year we build the timetable around staffing expertise and student interest.
- We are looking at a noon hour supervision fee of:
 - i. \$30for ECS students
 - ii. \$60 for grade 1-6 students
 - 1. This was calculated using a standardized EIPS noon hour supervision formula


